## MARK YOUR CALENDAR—WINTERIZATION

Autumn is in the air and winter is right around the corner. It is time for Port Operations to get the marina ready for colder temperatures and winter weather.

**Important: The marina water will be turned off by October 31st.**



Please **remove** chairs, bikes, coolers, buckets, rugs, mops and all other personal items from the docks by the end of the October. All personal items left on the docks and piers after **November 30th** will be removed by port staff and donated to charity. Why is this important you may ask? Poor housekeeping creates unsightly clutter and hazards on the docks making it difficult for responders in case of emergency. Thank you for your help!

### INVASIVE AQUATIC PLANT TREATMENT

The Port of Kennewick has contracted Lakeland Restoration Services, LLC to perform an herbicide treatment to control aquatic vegetation in the Clover Island boat basin. **The treatment will occur on or between October 31<sup>th</sup> and November 4th, 2016.** In order to help prevent fragmentation, please **DO NOT** cut, rake or hand-pull plants prior to treatment. **Product(s) planned for aquatic use:** Diquat and Aquathol K. **Swimming Restrictions:** It has been advised that **no swimming** occur within the treated areas(s) during or for 24 hours following treatment. **Drinking Water Restrictions:** Do not use water from treatment area for three (3) days. **Irrigation Restrictions:** Do not use water from treatment area for 3 days. **Stock Watering Restrictions:** Do not use water from treatment area for 7 days.

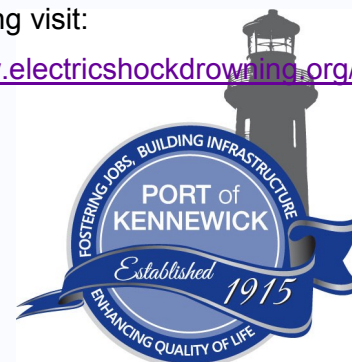

To access information from the website on this project, go to the bulletin board, click projects and finally click Port of Kennewick. **This application will involve the use of airboats.** **Please remove items from docks such as lawn chairs, flower pots, personal/recreational flotation devices, etc. prior to October 21st to protect your property.**

### SHORE POWER CORDS

We cannot stress enough the importance of using a good shore power cord. Electrical shock drownings are real and one reason why there is no swimming allowed in the marina.

- All shore power cords should be rated for marine use or UL-Marine.
- Never use ordinary “outdoor use” extension cords to power a boat or any equipment such as a battery charger on board a boat.
- Do not let cords hang in water.
- Make sure cord is removed from pedestal when not in use.
