REGISTRATION RENEWALS

The Washington State Department of Revenue requires marinas to maintain copies of registrations for all boats in moorage. Please remember to bring a copy of your current boat registration to the marina office or leave it in the night drop box, located on the south side of the building (facing the marina).

MARINA BUDDY SYSTEM

It is helpful to look out for each other and each other's boats. Making friends along the dock adds to the pleasures of enjoying the marina; it also increases everyone's safety. It's important to get to know your dock neighbors and the best way to contact them.



SHOREPOWER CORDS



We cannot stress enough the importance of using a UL-Marine rated power cord. Electrical shock drownings are real and one reason why there is no swimming allowed in the marina.

- ⇒ All shore power cords should be rated suitable for Marine Use, or better still, "UL-Marine" listed for marine shore power applications.
- ⇒ **CAUTION**—Never use ordinary "outdoor use" extension cords to provide electrical shore power to the boat or any equipment, such as a battery charger on board the boat. These cords are not rated for and are not suitable for the severity of a marine environment. They can deteriorate and/or overheat causing electrical shock, a short circuit or a fire.
- ⇒ Never leave a shore power cord on the dock with only the plugged end connected. A live cord end is dangerous, especially if it accidentally falls into the water.
