#### REPORTS COMMENTS AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

#### A. Annual Commissioner Responsibilities

Ms. Scott stated the Port's Commission Rules of Policy and Procedure, adopted February 28, 2011, provides an in-depth description of the Commission's purpose, authority and responsibilities. Ms. Scott provided a brief summary of the Commissioner's annual responsibilities including the adoption of the work plan and budget; establishing and reviewing ad hoc committees; the performance evaluation of the Executive Director; filing Personal Financial Affairs Statements; and submitting a statement acknowledging and disclosing any conflicts of interest and any current or prospective economic relationships. Ms. Scott offered her assistance in locating the forms on the PDC's website.

Mr. Arntzen shared the Port's Commission Rules of Policy and Procedure requires more reporting requirements than State law mandates.

#### B. Clover Island / Columbia Drive

### 1. Duffy's Pond Update

Ms. Bader Inglima and Mr. Peterson met with City of Kennewick's staff and the Infrastructure Committee to request approval for City of Kennewick staff to work with the Port to explore options for improving Duffy's Pond and potentially sub-leasing the area to the Port.

The third step in the process is to attend the City of Kennewick's workshop tonight to present the conceptual plans with Steve Mallory and request formal approval from the City Council. Ms. Bader Inglima is hopeful the City will approve the request.

Ms. Bader Inglima reported a great Editorial Board article was published in the Tri-City Herald as a follow-up to the meeting with the Infrastructure Committee indicating those are good options for the Port and City to pursue. Ms. Bader Inglima feels the public is supportive of cleaning up the area and providing better recreational access. It is also a way of complimenting the commercial development planned for Columbia Drive.

Ms. Bader Inglima stated The ShareFest event to clean up Duffy's Pond is scheduled for March 24, 2012. Anyone interested in volunteering should register with ShareFest.

#### 2. Clover Island Shoreline Update

Mr. Peterson introduced John Fetterolf of JF Engineering. Mr. Fetterolf reviewed design concepts for shoreline improvements from the lighthouse plaza to the east end of the island. An overlook structure will be built near the lighthouse that resembles the bow of a ship and will project over the water about 10-15 feet. Vehicle and pedestrian approaches were considered in the design. Mr. Peterson commented a parcel large enough to attract public development remains on the west end of the island.

Additional design concepts include Adirondack Point, the North Plaza, the Diamond Plaza and Cedars intake structure.

Adirondack Point will be on Northeast corner of notch and will include sufficient space for event planning. The plaza is large enough to accommodate an art piece. Chris Herath is working on a generic building design for conceptual purposes.

Diamond Plaza is on the north side of Clover Island Inn. It will be a formal space, and the design team is considering the use of recycled blue glass tile in the sidewalk.

The Cedars Intake Structure will be the only one of the three intake structures to remain. The existing top will be removed, creating a larger cantilevered structure that could incorporate local art work. This feature will also serve to transition the trail from a meandering sidewalk to more of a linear feature. The path will be lower at Cedars boat dock and will include ADA compliant pathways to the hotel and restaurant. Mr. Fetterolf has consulted with Dave Mitcham about the plans and will talk with the hotel owners in March. Ms. Bader Inglima stated the hotel requested ADA access to the dock in the past to accommodate the cruise ships. An overlook structure will be built on the east end of the island.

Mr. Peterson reminded the Commission that the Work Plan and previous discussions mandate the remaining improvements are tied to grant funding. The design dollars were allocated so it would be possible to have biddable construction documents to put the Port in a better position to obtain grant funding. Ms. Bader Inglima reiterated one of the only items many of the grant agencies will allow is recouping architectural and engineering expenditures.

The Commission approves the design concept. Mr. Peterson will provide updates throughout the project. Mr. Novakovich thanked Ms. Bader Inglima for her help in removing the deed restrictions on the corner parcel.

#### C. Vista Field

FBO Lease Update

Mr. Arntzen stated he met with Dr. Shannon a couple weeks ago. Dr. Shannon will write his expectations on the draft agreement and return it for the Port's review. Mr. Arntzen reported financial statements and the FBO operator manual was forwarded to Dr. Shannon for his review. Mr. Arntzen feels the agreement is moving forward and will provide future updates.

#### D. West Richland Joint Economic Development Committee

Mr. Novakovich stated a joint Economic Development Committee (WREDC) was formed in 2011 with West Richland to review projects that would benefit economic development in West Richland, with the stipulation that investments made by the Port would provide a return on investment to the Port.

The WREDC met yesterday to discuss amending the Port's Comprehensive Scheme as the West Richland project specified in the Comp Scheme, considering the economic times, may not be the right plan for West Richland. The Port will re-evaluate and proceed with a

project that will provide the best economic benefit to West Richland, while providing an immediate return on investment to the Port.

Mayor Donna Noski, City of West Richland, 3801 W. Van Giesen, read a letter into the record. The City of West Richland respectfully requested the Port consider a delay in plans to begin architectural and site plans for a new development building at Red Mountain Center in order to provide adequate time for further strategic planning. Ms. Noski extended an invitation for a joint meeting in early spring or summer.

The Commission is in consensus to delay the plans for Red Mountain Center for further strategic planning. City and Port staff will organize a joint meeting.

#### E. Worldwide Wine Industry Update

Mr. Arntzen stated a few years ago the Port made a commitment to support the wine industry. Since that time, the Port has completed a wine incubator study and sold property in West Richland that now is occupied by major wineries such as Pacific Rim. Currently, the Port is working with Professor Black of Integrated Structures Inc., on the Willows property located on Columbia Drive, and is contemplating a wine incubator or wine element could be included in the plans.

Mr. Arntzen stated that 90% of wineries are beautiful estates usually set among vineyards. However, he discovered that before prohibition, wineries were located in major cities like San Francisco, New York and Los Angeles; and the grapes were brought in for processing. After prohibition, the wineries moved away from the cities and into rural areas.

Mr. Arntzen commented in the 1980's micro-breweries moved into the cities and draw people back into the city. He believes the same situation is happening in the wine industry. There are a couple different types of urban wineries: purely commercial and wine centers. The wine centers not only create the wine, but feature a wine bar, restaurants and anything that provides an attraction for people. Mr. Arntzen feels a wine center may provide the Port another tool in the economic toolbox.

Many communities are embracing this concept as it brings people back to the downtown areas. Recently, the Kennewick City Council saw the wisdom in removing the restrictions for mid-size wineries and revised the ordinances to allow wineries within city limits. Portland is on the cutting edge of urban wineries and has 6-10 small wineries; and South Seattle by Boeing Field has 6-7 wineries.

Mr. Arntzen feels wine centers are an upcoming trend and that this is a good concept and could help redevelop downtown or waterfronts; unique items could bring people back to downtown.

Mr. Novakovich requested Mr. Arntzen provide pictures and a report after visiting an urban winery.

#### F. Commissioner Hanson Resignation

Mr. Novakovich commented that Mr. Hanson stated he would provide a resignation statement at this meeting. Mr. Hanson agreed and stated he would retire effective March 31, 2012. Mr. Hanson submitted a letter to formalize the decision. Mr. Novakovich read the letter into the record.

<u>MOTION:</u> Commissioner Wagner moved approval to accept Commissioner Hanson's resignation from the Port Commission effective March 31, 2012; Commissioner Novakovich seconded. With no further discussion motion carried unanimously. All in favor 3:0.

Ms. Luke stated no further action is needed immediately; however, upon the effective date of the vacancy, the Port has a period of time to appoint someone to the vacant position. If the Commission fails within the designated time period to appoint someone, the County would be responsible for the appointment.

Ms. Luke is reviewing the process and will prepare a memo for the Commission's review.

#### G. Staff Activities, Current Projects and Anticipated Workload Issues

Mr. Novakovich stated the Port is managing many projects; we are a small port with limited staff and financial resources, and have five jurisdictional partners to serve. Mr. Novakovich respectfully requests the public to not be surprised if some projects are delayed. Mr. Novakovich feels staff is doing a wonderful job to keep everything moving forward, and at the same time, meet all the demands of the public. We will continue do the best job we can.

## H. Commissioner Meetings (formal and informal meetings with groups or individuals) Mr. Hanson attended the Tri-Cities Legislative Reception in Olympia.

Mr. Wagner attended the Tri-Cities Legislative Reception in Olympia, the Tri-Cities Rivershore Enhancement Council (TREC) meeting and George Jones' birthday party.

Mr. Novakovich attended regular meetings, George Jones' birthday party, several meetings with the Columbia Basin Veterans Coalition; the Benton Franklin Humane Society building committee; met with West Richland Council Members Gail Brown and Rich Buel; attended the West Richland City Council meeting; a meeting with Karen Baker and Art King; a meeting with Senator Patty Murray and gave a presentation to the Kennewick Kiwanis.

#### I. Non-Scheduled Items

- 1. Mr. Hanson suggested the FBO agreement be expedited.
- 2. Mr. Hanson inquired about the Air Race Classic. Ms. Hancock will meet with Marjy Leggett and provide an update at the next meeting. Mr. Arntzen commented there is an opportunity for an optional grant filing. Ms. Bader Inglima and Mr. Arntzen will review what types of capital improvements are needed before the race and see if they would be covered through the grant. Ms. Bader Inglima requested Ms. Leggett provide a list of the needs of the Air Race Classic as the grant is due March 31, 2012. Ms. Bader Inglima will determine if the requested needs meet the grant and Vista Field Master Plan guidelines and will prepare a resolution.

- 3. Mr. Peterson stated the Clover Island Yacht Club (CIYC) shared tentative plans to rebuild their covered moorage. The CIYC is mindful of the Port's improvements to the island and would like to consult with the Port regarding the design and roof color. This project will substantially improve the CIYC and the overall appearance when entering the island.
- 4. Mr. Arntzen attended the Tri-Cities Rivershore Enhancement Council (TREC) meeting; while there, Port of Benton Commissioner Bob Larson inquired if the Port of Kennewick has space available to set up a portion of the carousel. Ms. Hancock will work with the carousel committee to locate available space.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Mr. Don Derifield, 2008 W. Falls Avenue, Kennewick. Mr. Derifield shared that he utilizes the trails around Duffy's Pond and feels it should be handled properly, as it is a wild life and recreational resource. Mr. Derifield stated there is a lot of private property adjoining the pond and believes it would cost a substantial amount of money to purchase the property. Mr. Derifield would like to learn more about the Port's plans for Duffy's Pond.

Mr. Mike White, 1118 W. 22<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Kennewick. Mr. White inquired what type of metals would be used at the newly proposed overlook and suggested the Port address the potential for metals galvanizing. Mr. White suggested a natural basalt column be used as the vertical element.

No further public comments were made.

Mr. Novakovich anticipates the Executive Session to last approximately 20 minutes for a real estate matter, minimum price, per RCW 42.30.110(1)(c) with no action anticipated. Mr. Novakovich asked the public to notify Port staff if they will return after the executive session. The public will not return.

Mr. Novakovich recessed the meeting at 3:17 p.m. for approximately 8 minutes.

Mr. Novakovich reconvened the meeting into Executive Session at 3:25 p.m.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

#### INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT between

#### THE CITY OF WEST RICHLAND AND THE PORT OF KENNEWICK, WASHINGTON, for

#### Construction / Project Management Assistance

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT is entered into this 2 day of February, 2012 between the City of West Richland, Washington, a Washington Municipal Corporation and the Port of Kennewick, Washington, referred to as the "Jurisdictions".

WHEREAS, the Jurisdictions are, pursuant to Chapter 39.34 RCW (the Interlocal Cooperation Act), authorized to exercise their powers jointly, thereby maximizing their ability to provide services and facilities which will best fulfill common needs of the Jurisdictions, and;

WHEREAS, the Jurisdictions have determined that there are several projects that would mutually benefit both the Port of Kennewick and the City of West Richland that will provide significant safety improvements and enhanced aesthetic appeal, and is in the best interest of the Jurisdictions and the public and;

WHEREAS, said projects will improve vehicular access, improve wine industry development, industrial waste treatment and tourism, improve and enhance the appeal of the City to attract economic development within the Port District which serves Port-owned land held for sale and/or lease in the Red Mountain Center and other parts of the city improving access and/or infrastructure leading to Red Mountain Center and Port-owned property adjacent to City of West Richland;

WHEREAS, the Jurisdictions, by their respective governing bodies, have determined this effort may be best implemented on a shared basis in a manner deemed most efficient and effective for the Jurisdictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Jurisdictions agree as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Agreement is to formalize a commitment to completing several projects in West Richland, Washington (the Projects), which would enhance the economic development and quality of life in the community and Port-owned properties in and adjacent to West Richland

- **Section 2. Administration.** This Agreement shall be administered by the West Richland Economic Development Director. Such person shall be responsible for:
  - (a) Establishing policies for implementing this Agreement;
  - (b) Providing periodic progress reports;
- (c) Monitoring progress of the Jurisdictions and other agencies in the fulfillment of their respective responsibilities.
- (d) Follow proper Port bid law policies and procedures when awarding the bid for project management assistance.
- **Section 3. Funding.** The Port of Kennewick commits to providing project funding as follows:
  - Construction / Project Management Assistance \$50,000
    Such Port of Kennewick funding shall be used for construction / project management assistance, contracted support, and other expenses associated with facilitating 2012 projects in the City of West Richland.
  - **Section 4.** The City of West Richland commits to matching support including assignment of city staff to Port/City special projects where Port funds are invested within the City; planning and administration of Van Giesen redevelopment; construction & façade programs; project administration; and coordination, engineering support, marketing communications, and regular reporting of Port / City partnership projects.
- **Section 5. Modification.** This Agreement may be modified by written consent of both parties.

#### Section 6. Term of Agreement and Termination.

- (a) The Term of this Agreement shall be from date of signature to completion of projects, and/or shall terminate on 12/31/2012.
- **Section 7. Inspection of Records.** The records and documents with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement shall be subject to inspection by any Jurisdiction during the term of this Agreement and for three years after its termination.
- **Section 8.** No Separate Legal Entity. It is not the intention that a separate legal entity be established to conduct the cooperative undertaking nor is the acquiring, holding or disposing of real or personal property anticipated.

**Section 9. Severability.** In the event any term or condition of this Agreement or application thereof to any person, entity or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect any other terms, conditions or applications of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid term, condition, or application. To this end, the terms and conditions of this Agreement are declared severable.

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT is entered into this 28 day of February, 2012 between the City of West Richland, Washington, a Washington Municipal Corporation and the Port of Kennewick, Washington, referred to as the "Jurisdictions".

**WHEREAS**, the Jurisdictions are, pursuant to Chapter 39.34 RCW (the Interlocal Cooperation Act), authorized to exercise their powers jointly, thereby maximizing their ability to provide services and facilities which will best fulfill common needs of the Jurisdictions, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Jurisdictions have determined that there are several projects that would mutually benefit both the Port of Kennewick and the City of West Richland that will provide significant safety improvements and enhanced aesthetic appeal, and is in the best interest of the Jurisdictions and the public and;

**WHEREAS**, said projects will improve vehicular access, improve industrial waste treatment, improve and enhance the appeal of the City to attract economic development within the Port District which serves Port-owned land held for sale and/or lease in the Red Mountain Center and other parts of the city improving access and/or infrastructure adjacent to Red Mountain Center and Port-owned property adjacent to City of West Richland;

**WHEREAS**, the Jurisdictions, by their respective governing bodies, have determined this effort may be best implemented on a shared basis in a manner deemed most efficient and effective for the Jurisdictions;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Jurisdictions agree as follows:

- **Section 1. Purpose.** The purpose of this Agreement is to formalize a commitment to completing several projects in West Richland, Washington (the Projects), which would enhance the economic development and quality of life in the community and Port-owned properties in and adjacent to West Richland
- **Section 2. Administration.** This Agreement shall be administered by the West Richland Economic Development Director. Said person shall be responsible for:
  - (a) Establishing policies for implementing this Agreement;
  - (b) Providing periodic progress reports;
- (c) Monitoring progress of the Jurisdictions and other agencies in the fulfillment of their respective responsibilities.
- (d) Follow proper Port bid law policies and procedures when awarding the bid for project.
- **Section 3. Funding.** The Port of Kennewick commits to providing project funding as follows:

Community Economic Revitalization Board (CERB) Match Funding \$25,000 Such Port of Kennewick funding shall be used for costs associated with installation of infrastructure, irrigation, and other improvements at the Cityowned Belmont Job Center, associated with a CERB matching loan and other matching investments. These improvements include site improvement design, surveying, geotechnical services, and purchase of CID irrigation water.

**Section 4.** The City of West Richland has/will make the following investments in this project:

- \$820,000 CERB Loan. The City has committed to a CERB loan, with full repayment required to CERB over a 20-year period (This includes acquisition of approximately 4 acres at the Belmont Job Center).
- \$1.3 Million additional land acquisition. In addition to the CERB-associated land/infrastructure commitment, the City of West Richland is acquiring an additional 34 acres for further economic development and industrial growth in the vicinity of the CERB project.
- Additional historic City investments include decommissioning of a previous water process facility, restoration and cleanup of the property, construction of Keene Road and other investments.
- The City has also secured additional match funding and grants in order to leverage the City's and Port's investments in this project.

**Section 5. Modification.** This Agreement may be modified by written consent of both parties.

Section 6. Term of Agreement and Termination.

- (a) The Term of this Agreement shall be from date of signature to completion of projects, and/or shall terminate on 12/31/2012.
- **Section 7. Inspection of Records.** The records and documents with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement shall be subject to inspection by any Jurisdiction during the term of this Agreement and for three years after its termination.
- **Section 8.** No **Separate Legal Entity.** It is not the intention that a separate legal entity be established to conduct the cooperative undertaking nor is the acquiring, holding or disposing of real or personal property anticipated.
- **Section 9. Severability.** In the event any term or condition of this Agreement or application thereof to any person, entity or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect any other terms, conditions or applications of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid term, condition, or application. To this end, the terms and conditions of this Agreement are declared severable.
